District Level Orientation Workshop on Adi Karmayogi Abhiyan

Jamshedpur, Aug 25: A district level orientation meeting-cum-workshop under the Adi Karmayogi Abhiyan was organized at the Collectorate Auditorium today, following the directions of Deputy Commissioner Karn Satyarthi. The workshop aimed at giving new direction to rural development through community participation and solution-based approaches. The programme was chaired by Deputy Development Commissioner Nagendra Paswan and attended by officers from Welfare, Social Welfare, Education, Health, Technical Department, as well as all Block Development Officers of the district. Officials informed that a three-day training programme is scheduled to



be held at Sigdora Town Hall from August 28 to 30. During the workshop, the Deputy Development Commissioner stressed that the main goal of the campaign is to ensure effective implementation of schemes for the holistic development of tribal communities. He said Adi Karmayogi

centres will be set up at village level, displaying the name and contact details of nodal officers, enabling villagers to directly raise their issues. Each village will decide its priorities, and development plans will be implemented accordingly, he added. Emphasizing the importance

of convergence of resources, Paswan said the active involvement of Gram Panchayat secretaries, volunteers and local communities is crucial. The campaign will also be linked to a digital platform to provide villagers access to multiple services and schemes in one place, ultimately paving the way for

self-reliant and empowered villages. The Adi Karmayogi Abhiyan has been structured into three phases to ensure participation from all sections of society. Under the Adi Sahyogi phase, teachers, doctors and professionals will provide guidance. In the Adi Sathi phase, self-help groups, Mahila Mandals, elderly, youth and public representatives will assist in implementation. The Karmayogi phase will involve active local community workers in execution. The orientation programme marked the beginning of a district-wide effort to integrate government schemes with community-driven solutions, with the aim of building a sustainable and participatory model of rural development. Illegal arms manufacturing unit busted in Sonari, Ganja and cash seized

Jamshedpur, Aug 25: In a major crackdown, police unearthed an illegal arms manufacturing unit and seized narcotics, weapons and a large sum of cash during raids in Tilla Bhatta, Sonari. The operation was conducted at the houses and warehouse of Sameer Sardar and Lakhindra Sardar, where police recovered 1.4 kg of ganja, a 7.65 bore pistol, 11 live cartridges, Rs 2.41 lakh cash, a gold chain, three mobile phones, an Apple iPad and multiple ID documents. The raid also uncovered sophisticated tools and machines used for arms manufacturing, including a lathe machine, milling machine, drilling machine, grinder and semi-finished pistol parts. Police said the operation was launched after a tip-off on August 23, with a team led by the City SP under the instructions of the SSP. The accused managed to flee before the raid, but searches are ongoing to apprehend them. SSP Piyush Pandey described the bust as "a significant blow to organized crime", affirming that all culprits will be brought to justice. Cases under the Arms Act and NDPS Act have been registered. DC assures farmers of paddy payment, calls for scaling up notebook production

Jamshedpur, Aug 25: Deputy Commissioner Karn Satyarthi today undertook a field visit to Ghatsila block, where he inspected the Krishak Pathshala being run under the Integrated Birs Gram Vikas Yojana at Fuldungri village of Dharambhal Panchayat and also interacted with self-employment groups engaged in notebook manufacturing. At the Krishak Pathshala, the Deputy Commissioner held discussions with farmers on the opportunities, benefits and steps required to enhance agricultural practices. He enquired about the coverage of Kisan Credit Card (KCC) loans and urged officials to ensure that deprived farmers are linked to the scheme. Stressing the importance of modern farming practices, he said that the Pathshala provides a platform for farmers to learn about advanced technology, crop diversification and Farmers



Producer Organisations (FPOs). He directed officials and NGO representatives to connect farmers from nine nearby villages with the FPO and motivate them to participate actively. During the interaction, some farmers raised complaints about the delay in receiving the second installment of paddy procurement payments through Lamps. Taking cognizance, the Deputy Commissioner assured them of timely redressal. He also inspected the crops and ongoing activities at the

Pathshala, instructing officials to run it systematically and spread awareness on modern agricultural techniques. Later, the Deputy Commissioner visited the notebook manufacturing unit run by women self-help groups in Fuldungri. He appreciated the quality of the notebooks and held discussions on marketing, design and supply chain management. He emphasized the need to maintain product quality, reduce costs and align production with market demand in order to remain

competitive. He also directed officials to scale up production, assist in establishing market linkages, and facilitate tie-ups with schools and stationery outlets for better sales. Highlighting the district administration's priorities, Satyarthi said that strengthening the rural economy requires a twin approach of connecting farmers with technology-based agriculture and creating self-employment opportunities for women. "The benefits of government schemes will be truly realized only when farmers and groups become self-reliant and align their efforts with market needs," he added. Director NEP Santosh Garg, SDO Ghatsila Sunil Chandra, District Public Relations Officer Panchanan Oraon, District Agriculture Officer Vivek Birua, BDO Unique Sharma and other officials accompanied the Deputy Commissioner during the visit. Health Dept admits Banna Gupta appointed ineligible person to Pharmacy Council

Saryu Roy had raised issue in Assembly, Council cancelled registration on ineligibility

Jamshedpur, Aug 25: The Jharkhand Health, Medical Education and Family Welfare Department admitted in the Assembly on Monday that former Health Minister Banna Gupta had deliberately appointed an ineligible person to a key position in the Jharkhand State Pharmacy Council.

Responding to a short notice question raised by Jamshedpur West MLA Saryu Roy, the department confirmed that Rahul Kumar, a non-government individual, was appointed as the in-charge Registrar-cum-Secretary of the Council, despite not meeting the required eligibility criteria. A departmental inquiry revealed that although a list of qualified government pharmacists was already available, Gupta overlooked it and appointed Rahul Kumar instead. The department further admitted that the Council had since cancelled Rahul Kumar's pharmacist and tribunal registrations after finding him ineligible. However, it avoided responding to Roy's



demand for punitive action against those responsible for the irregular appointment. Roy pressed the government to clarify when it would take action against the officials and individuals who conspired in the wrongful appointment. The government, however, only acknowledged the irregularity but refrained from committing to any disciplinary measures. The Assembly session witnessed an uproar over the matter, leading to an adjournment before any detailed discussion or debate could take place. (w/gsd)

Scooter stolen in broad daylight at Sakchi market

Jamshedpur, Aug 25: Vehicle thefts in the city continue unabated. On Monday, a scooter was stolen in broad daylight from Appanna Line in Sakchi market. The two-wheeler, a grey metallic Suzuki Access (JH-05 CF-4266), belonged to local shopkeeper Ajay Kumar, who had parked it in front of his shop "Ramshankar Ajay Kumar." The theft occurred at 4:58 pm and was captured on nearby CCTV cameras, which clearly showed the thief starting the scooter with ease and fleeing the spot. Ajay Kumar immediately filed a complaint at Sakchi police station. Investigations are underway.

Unfortunate, prejudicial misinterpretation: Retired judges slam Shah's remarks on Oppn V-P pick

A group of retired judges has termed Home Minister Amit Shah's attack on opposition vice-presidential candidate B Sudershan Reddy over the Salwa Judum judgement "unfortunate", and said it would be wise to refrain from "name-calling". The group of 18 retired judges, including the likes of former Supreme Court justices Kurien Joseph, Madan Lokur and J Chelameswar, also said that "prejudicial misinterpretation" of the top court's verdict by a high political functionary is likely to have a chilling effect on its judges. Shah had accused Reddy, a former judge of the Supreme Court, of "supporting" Naxalism. He had claimed that Left Wing Extremism would have ended by 2020 in the absence of the Salwa Judum judgement. "The statement of Union Home Minister Amit Shah, publicly misinterpreting the judgment of the Supreme Court in the Salwa Judum case, is unfortunate. The judgment nowhere supports, either expressly or by compelling implication of its text, Naxalism or its ideology," the statement signed by the 18 former judges said. The former Supreme Court judges who signed the statement are AK Patnaik, Abhay Oka, Gopala Gowda, Vikramjit Sen, Kurien Joseph, Madan B Lokur and J Chelameswar. "While the campaign for the office of the Vice-President of India may well be ideological, it can be conducted civilly and with dignity. Criticising the so-called

ideology of either candidate should be eschewed," the retired judges said. "Prejudicial misinterpretation of a judgment of the Supreme Court by a high political functionary is likely to have a chilling effect on the judges of the Supreme Court, shaking the independence of the judiciary," they said. Out of respect for the office of the Vice President of India, it would be wise to refrain from "name-calling," the retired judges said. Besides the seven retired judges of the Supreme Court, three former Chief Justices of High Courts — Govind Mathur, S Muralidhar and Sanjib Bannerjee — also signed the statement. The other signatories to the letter include former judges of high courts Anjana Prakash, C Praveen Kumar, A Gopal Reddy, G Raghuram, K Kannan, K Chandru, B Chandrakumar and Kailash Gambhir. Prof Mohan Gopal and senior advocate Sanjay Hegde also

signed the statement. Speaking in Kerala on Friday, Shah said, "Sudershan Reddy is the person who helped Naxalism. He gave Salwa Judum judgment. If the Salwa Judum judgment had not been given, the Naxal terrorism would have ended by 2020. He is the person who was inspired by the ideology that gave Salwa Judum judgment." Reddy, on Saturday, said he did not wish to join issues with the Home Minister, asserting the verdict was not his but that of the Supreme Court. He also said that Shah would not have made the remarks had he read the complete judgment. He, along with Justice SS Nijjar, was part of an apex court bench that had in July 2011 ordered the disbanding of Salwa Judum, ruling that using tribal youths as Special Police Officers in the fight against Maoist insurgents was illegal and unconstitutional.
